The Steel City Briar - Hamilton '91

At the Friars' Briar Annual Meeting in Portage la Prairie, the Ontario clergy agreed to make plans to host the '91 Briar in Hamilton. The Labatt Brier was to be held in Copps Coliseum and the Friars had now had two consecutive events in the West. Accordingly, an active committee was formed with Clive Simpson of Burlington as chair and Bert Young as secretary and registrar. Ken Cowper looked after the finances.

There was room and to spare in the Spacious Copps Coliseum with its many attractive facilities to accommodate the Canadian Mens' Championships. The Friars had seats on the side near the ice surface where we could keep in touch with everything. Our curling was done at the Dundas Granite Curling Club and the Dundas Valley Club. On the Thursday morning, we curled at the Burlington Golf and Country Club. Transportation was arranged by local clergy and lay persons to the various rinks as required.

Competition was keen in the '91 Briar as many rinks from the East who had not played in the Friars' Briar before, were registered. Fraser Muldrew's rink from Manitoba struck gold for the third time since the Briar began in 1978. On his rink were Ken Innes, Roger Coll and brother Milton. Silver was won for the second time in the Briar's history by Gerry Ward of Alberta. On his rink were former associates from his St. Catharines days like Merrill Graham, Carmen Holbrough and Mike Beacon. Bronze went to a Kitchener-Waterloo rink skipped by Harry Klassen and included Bob Gmeindl, Jeff Smith and Wilmer Minke.

It was noted that, in past times many local rinks who were within driving distance from home, tended to take off as soon as their last game was over. This year, the local arrangements included plans for the Awards Banquet and Annual Meeting to be held in the Dundas Granite Curling Rink right after the final games. This gave every curler the opportunity to enjoy the closing festivities and take part in the discussion of the nature of future Briar arrangements.

The local committee was praised for the thoroughness of their plans for curling, accommodations and transportation. Twenty spaces were reserved at the Holiday Inn in Burlington which was central to our activities. Other motels were detailed so that visitors could choose their own location and price. Funds were available to assist out-of-province curlers with travel costs.

Because of the difficulty in obtaining a block of tickets for the Brier games and the risk involved for the local committees to be sure of selling same, it was decided at the Association's Annual Meeting that, in future, only prepaid tickets would be booked ahead of time.

The following list of participating rinks indicates the good response that we had from all parts of Ontario and the financial pressure many in the West felt, which limited their numbers. However, when word got out that Regina had invited us next year, we were sure of a great show!


