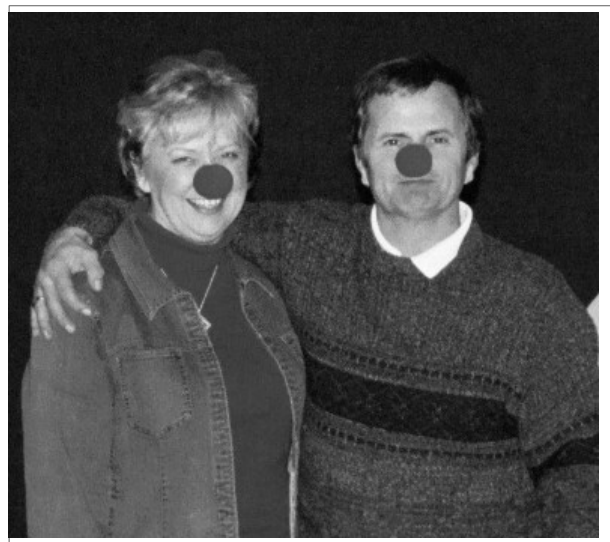
So the last score has been hung up on the board. It is time to hand out the trophies and the medals.
