To keep family and friends back home in the loop, webmaster Ken Murdoch kept the website current with the daily draw-by-draw results forwarded to him by draw master Paul.

The Victoria Curling Club was so pleased to be able to host our event and provide not only great ice surfaces but also other services such as a cafe and pub, TV reception of the other Brier, and our catered meals and banquet. Within easy walking distance, the City Centre Hotel provided comfortable rooms and an onsite cafe. All in all, this compact venue combination worked well.
